Deputy’s Corner



Leave the Leaves to Us!



Every year, leaves are swept onto roads and storm drains as citizens tidy their yards. What you may not know is this: When broken leaves and yard debris get into the storm drains, they clog and cause oth-

er issues within the water recycling process. In order to make cleaning up more convenient for everyone, we provide a free-of-charge leaf pick up!

There is not an official start date for taking pick up requests, so whenever the leaves begin to fall, call City Hall at (541) 895-2531 and press 0 or 1. You may also schedule a pick up online. All you need to do is go to our website at: www.ci.creswell.or.us. On the homepage, click the icon, "Chat with Creswell". This will take you to the online request form: "Citizen Request". Please fill in the required information and click 'Submit Request'.

We ask that leaves be bagged and curbside before they're picked up. Thank you!

Winter Sewer Rates

Starting October 1st, we transition to Winter sewer rates for the months of October through April, which are based on *actual* water consumption. **This is a standard seasonal change.**

Your usage is measured in cubic feet, not gallons. There is a base rate of \$38.87 for the first 300 cubic feet used. An additional \$2.93 is applied for every 100 cubic feet of usage after that. Because we have been asked in the past how to convert cubic feet to gallons, and would like to give our customers a better understanding of how usage is calculated, here is the formula for translating cubic feet into gallons:

1 Cubic Foot = 7.483 gallons

The minimum charge for 300 cubic feet of water (or 2,244.9 gallons) is \$37.17. For 300 cubic feet of sewer, it costs \$38.87.

With school come those big flashing yellow lights indicating school is in session and kids are present. Remember the speed is 20mph when those lights are flashing, and the area of N 10th St between Oregon and A St and A St from 10th to 5th is 20mph from 7am-5pm Mon-Fri. If you get caught, the fines are double. Another big reminder: school



busses. If the red lights flash or the stop sign comes out, both directions must stop. "If the lights flash, YOU don't get to pass."



Parents of high school age kids that are beginning or have just gotten their licenses, remember that new drivers under age 18 cannot have passengers in their cars under age 20 that are not a family member for the first six months they have their license. After the first six months they can have no more than 3 passengers under age 20. This is a significant fine. Please remind them that seatbelts are mandatory in Oregon.

There were recently a number of vehicle break-ins and thefts in the Creswell area. With some good investigating, your Deputies were able to solve a large

portion of them by arresting one suspect. Please remember to secure valuables, lock cars, and always report crime in your neighborhood. Only one of the thefts uncovered in this incident had actually been reported. We are here to help you, and sometimes it only takes one small break in a case to unravel several others.

There have been some personnel changes to your Creswell Sheriffs. SGT Scott Denham is back in the contract as the new supervisor. SGT Halvorson is now acting as a Lieutenant for the Sheriff's Office. Deputy Holiman is now your daytime deputy and Deputy Mckenney is still on night time service. We would also like to welcome Deputy Derek Bastinelli to Creswell as your new deputy. Lastly, as always, if you are the victim of a crime or see something suspicious; call 911 in an emergency, or 541-682-4150 for non-emergency reporting.

Quirky Turkey Facts

- ◆ Since 1947, the National Turkey Federation has presented a live turkey and two dressed turkeys to the President. The President does not eat the live turkey. He "pardons" it and allows it to live out its days on a historical farm.
- ◆ The average American will consume 3,000 calories at Thanksgiving dinner and an overall total of 4,500 calories on Thanksgiving Day. Americans eat over 530 million pounds of Turkey on Thanksgiving, while more than 45 million turkeys are cooked and eaten on that day.
- ◆ Benjamin Franklin wanted the turkey to be the national bird. Thomas Jefferson opposed this idea and this is why it is believed Franklin named male turkeys "toms" to spite Jefferson.


